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## ABOUT IUC

Institutional University Cooperation (IUC) programme envisions a process of change in JOOUST at the level of individual, organizational as well as institutional leading to improved performance of the University as an Higher Education Institution (HEI). Further, the change that will be realized through Information and Communication Technology (ICT) is transversal and is expected to enhance both internal and external ICT service delivery in JOOUST. The Programme will also develop capacities and strategies to create the necessary conditions for research uptake at the community levels for the purpose of societal change and impact.

Jaramogi Oginga Odinga University of Science and Technology (JOOUST) has received research grant from VLIR-UOS through an Institutional University Cooperation (IUC) programme to strengthen its capacity in natural resource management, food security and health. The programme will strengthen and transform the University's structures, systems and processes throu gh creation of synergies in transformative knowledge, technologies and innovations in collaboration with four (4) Flemish Universities led by Vrije Universiteit Brussel (VUB). Other Universities are KU Leuven, Ghent University, and University of Antwerp.


# Programme Cycle 

This Programme started with a Phase In period on 1st March, 2021and will end on 31st August, 2022. The core of the IUC programme consists of 10 years of funding from VLIR-UOS divided in 2 phases of 5 years each and followed by a Phase Out.

These phases are jointly implemented via a tripartite agreement between JOOUST, VUB and VLIR-UOS. In this arrangement, VUB functions as the Flemish Coordinating University, meaning, together with JOOUST, VUB will be fully responsible for the management and implementation of the programme on behalf of the participating Flemish Institutions. Further, VLIR-UOS is responsible for the overall management of the IUC Programme Cycle including disbursement of funds to JOOUST through VUB as well as monitoring and evaluation. The Programme formulation and implementation is within the 5 sub-projects illustrated in Table 1 below and is managed by project leaders who are academic from both JOOUST and the 4 Flemish HEIs.


## JOOUST-VLIR IUC Programme Leaders

JOOUST Project Leaders were identified during the proposal development and have been confirmed as substantive leaders. On the other hand, the Flemish project leaders were appointed by VLIR-UOS after stage 2 of the IUC selection procedure on the basis of an open competition facilitated via matchmaking procedure and taking into consideration the advice of JOOUST.

Sound management structure that is aligned and integrated in JOOUST systems and procedures is critical for the success of the Programme. The University has consequently established and operationalized a Project Support Unit (PSU) to coordinate activities of the Programme. The PSU is headed by Prof. Benson Estambale, Programme Coordinator and supported by Mr. Naphtaly Osika, Programme Manager who are fulltime staff of the University.

The Programme Coordinator provides overall academic leadership and coordination while the Programme Manager provides methodological facilitation and administrative support to the programme. Office space has been allocated to the two officers that will also provide a boardroom facility to the team leader during physical meetings.
